Month: January, 2024

1. Significant Issues:

- a. Our plumbing issues from January have been resolved with new parts being installed. Have not experienced an issue since.
- b. Bookkeeper has been hired & scheduled to start on February 26

c. We've had several weather-related closures or delayed openings in February. Team Leads & Managers have updated the Inclement Weather Policy with minor adjustments to add more flexibility to the procedure. https://www.centre.prospectcommunities.com/wp-content/uploads/Inclement-Weather-Policy-winter-2024.pdf

2. Compliance Update:

- a. Current lottery licenses:
 - i. Ongoing weekly 50/50 draw; drawn on Fridays during Prospect Jammers
 - ii. Event-specific 50/50 draws; happening during weekly trivia nights

3. Progress on Goals/Strategic Plan Implementation:

a. Managers met with Team Leads & gave a brief overview of the upcoming Action Plan. We plan to have a meeting dedicated to review the document once completed by the Board to ensure Team Leads are aware of items that relate directly to their roles.

4. Items of Information:

a. Fitness Centre tender is live on HRM's site; deadline is March 8. A site visit is scheduled for February 20 for interested bidders.

b. Grants:

- i. Provincial Summer Student Grant: completed.
- ii. Canada Post: applied for \$25,000 towards youth programming. Decisions are not made until Summer and recipients are notified in October.
- iii. PRRA: applied for \$15,000 annual operational fund. PRRA is asking for more information and will only cap at \$10,000. Additional applications are being prepared for 4 different projects.

c. Farmers Market Update:

- i. We've partnered with Nova Scotia Loyal to help incentivize ordering from our Farmers Market for the month of February. NS Loyal provides funding to provide 5% discounts on each order for customers (returning and new). They have also provided marketing aid in the form of on-site 'street teams' who have visited the PRCC 3 times to educate patrons about the farmers market during busy business hours and who have also placed door-knockers on homes in the community about the market & the discount code. We have seen a small increase in ordering due to the discount & additional advertising. We have also had new vendors become interested in our market as a result.
- ii. We are waiting to hear about Nourish funding for the 2024 year. We hope to hear soon from Farmers Market of Nova Scotia as to whether or not we'll be able to continue our partnership with Schools Plus and offer families in need, from our community, the opportunity to order goods from each market.
- iii. We are working on surveying our vendors (existing and previous) about in-person markets ahead of the peak market season. We are hoping to gain further knowledge

about how we can make in-person markets more accessible for vendors (ie: do we need to change the day, time?). We aim to have this complete by mid-March so we can make decisions on how to best move forward ahead of peak season.

d. Spring programs will be released by March 1, 2024 - programs to start the week of April 15.
